JUDGE'S CRITIQUE FOR THE CAVALIER KING CHARLES SPANIEL CLUB OF VICTORIA INC, 58TH CHAMPIONSHIP SHOW, MONDAY 12TH JUNE 2023

Thank you to the officers and committee of the Victoria Club for the invitation to judge your show. The welcome and hospitality afforded to myself and my husband was second to none. I loved the venue and the huge ring that was set up which the exhibits were able to take full advantage of. I was happy with both line ups and it was great to see the quality particularly in the whole colours, something that we could do with in the UK! In general I was impressed with the uniformity on size however please watch heads as there were a few that were short in the foreface and therefore incorrect mouths are creeping in, having said that I was delighted with my winners. Also, a huge thanks goes to Michelle Ackland my very efficient and capable steward for the day, you may say you are not a steward but you really are!

Baby Puppy Dog (10 Entries, 0 Absent)



1. McCullough's Burford Talk About You at Caribelle – 5 month old blen boy who I am sure will have a bright future, attractive head with nice earset and well cushioned foreface, nicely arched neck with ample body and bone for his age. He is nicely market and has a well balanced outline with excellent hind angulation. He moved round the ring like a pro with a tail that never stopped wagging.
Best Baby Puppy in Show

2. Holloway's Kandccamo the Bolt Blazer – another quality blen boy of 5 months old, nice overall size and shape with a good coat coming through with attractive markings. He has well arched neck

and excellent bone with good angulation both front and rear. Pleasing head and expression with nice dark eye and nose pigment.

3. Brooksby's Cavashon Jet Lag – tri boy of 5 moths who is another quality boy. Good strong tan and, nice dark nose and eye pigment. A confident and happy boy who moved out well at all times keeping a nice outline with a good tailset.
4. Petersen's Dapsen If You Know You Know (AI) – Lighter marked blen baby with a perfect lozenge who has it all to give, nice head with lovely dark eye and nose pigment. Moved out well with a lovely arched neck and good shoulder. Just needs to come together which will come with age.
5. Brooksby's Cavashon Tyrone – heavier marked blen boy who has nice bone for size. Good front and rear angulation and moved out well.

Baby Puppy Bitch (9,0)



1. Brooksby's Cavashon Hello Kitty - richly marked blen girl who excels in her overall shape and size, which is ideal for her age. She has lovely chunky bone and excellent front and rear angulation. Well set ears and lovely dark eye and nose pigment, she motored round the ring keeping a level topline and tailset. Another exciting prospect

2. Holloway's Camilleri Kandccamo Good News from Spain – litter sister to the 2nd in Baby puppy dog and want an exciting pair of puppies they are with many of the same attributes. She excels in

neck and body proportions. Pleasing head and expression and moved out well at all times.

3. Underhill's Clerkenhill Madigans Miracle – nearly 5 months old who had a lovely head and expression with a well cushioned foreface. Lovely bone and good front and rear angulation, she has a lovely balanced shape with good topline and tailset.
4. Boyce's Alexabelle Two Point oh – ultra happy blen girl who is lighter in colouring than the winners. Sweet head and expression with dark nose and eye pigment and good earset. Well angulated hind quarters and moved steadily at all times.
5. McLaglin's Kqrac Tell Em They Are Dreaming – what a little cute bundle this 3 month old is. She has the darkest of nose and eye pigment and the prettiest of heads. Heavier marked in her jacket but that didn't distract from her overall quality. Moved out with confidence an exciting prospect.

Minor Puppy Dog (2,1)



1. Camilleri's Kandccamo Music To My Eyes – richly marked 6 month old blen who is the happiest of boys. Pleasing head and expression with well cushioned foreface and lovely dark eye pigment. Ample neck well a good shoulder and level topline and tailset, moved well and wouldn't want to see him grow much more.

Puppy Dog (6,0)



1. Paterson's Cabrook Cockney Classic (AI) – Blen boy who I see is sired by one of my favourites and he has inherited many of his fathers qualities. He has a gentle but masculine head and expression with a well cushioned foreface with limpid dark eyes and all framed by well set ears. He is an ideal size and has a super coat for his age. Nice neck and well balanced, presenting a nice outline. Moved round the ring well. Will watch his career with interest, Best Puppy Dog.

2. Brooksby's Ch Cavashon Black Art – well coated and presented tri boy with lovely rich tan in all the correct places. Masculine head an

expression with a well cushioned foreface framed by well set ears. He has a cobby body with a good spring of ribs. Moved well.

3. Humphries' Lookingglass Dancing Fever – Heavier marked blen who is the happiest of chaps. Pleasing head and expression with well set ears. Good front and rear angulation and moved round the ring well.
4. Lewis' Fredricos Cowboy Bebop – well coated black and tan who has a nice body with good spring of ribs and with ample bone, moved round the ring well keeping a level topline.
5. Oldaker's Cosmique Mr-Trueheart (Imp-NZ) – up to size 6 month old blen, pleasing head and expression with well cushioned foreface and lovey dark pigment. Stands four square and moved well.

Junior Dog (7,1)



1. Petersen's Dapsen The Secrets We Share – 15 month old tri boy who was shown in the most lovely coat and condition with excellent strong tan. Masculine head and expression that was framed by well set and feathered ears. Well made boy who you most definitely have to get your hands on to appreciate his qualities. Nice reach of neck with good shoulders, level topline and tailset. Moved round the ring with drive keeping an eye catching outline.

2. Brooksby's Ch. Absolutly Ink Jet – exuberant tri boy with the richest of tans, well coated and presented with lovely earset. Good bone for his size and nice spring of rib. Moved round the ring well.
3. Peachey's Matmor Tally Ho – richly coloured ruby who has the most melting head and expression framed by well set ears. Nice overall size and shape with good front and angulation. Moved well round the ring,
4. Ven Der Wolde's Clarely Sweet Music Man – another richly coloured ruby who is slightly up to size. Shown in good coat and condition and good front and rear angulation that he used to advantage on the move.
5. Creek's Lakeisha Time To Shine – 12 month old blen boy who had pleasing coated in nice condition and well marked. Nicely arched neck and good front, moved steadily.

Intermediate Dog (5,0)



1. Boyce's Ch Alexabelle Billy Elliot -one of my stars of the day this blen boy for me is the ideal size and shape. Shown in the lovely coat and condition with a well balanced and eye catching markings. Handsome head and expression with rich dark nose and eye pigment and lovely flat skull and well set ears. He has a lovely neck and shoulders which are used to advantage whilst he flows round the ring. Both standing and on the move he keeps an eye catching outline, standing four square and always with a happy wagging tail. He drives round the ring using his well angulated and muscled hind quarters. He pulled out all the

stops against his older kennel mate to clinch Reserve Best Dog and ultimately Reserve Best In Show.

2. McInnes' Innesveil Riverboat Dreams (A) – heavier marked blen boy who has the loveliest head and expressions, soft and gentle but still masculine with a well cushioned foreface. He has the darkest eyes and nose pigment and well set and feathered ears. Good bone for his size and well sprung ribs. Excellent front and rear angulation which he used to advantage as he drove round the ring keeping an eyecatching outline, a quality boy shown in lovely condition.
3. McLaughlin's Aust Ch Kqrac The Ring Of Steel – well coated blen boy with lovely rich strong colour. Masculine head and expression with limpid dark eyes and excellent nose pigment. Well arched neck, level topline and tailset. Moved steadily round the ring.
4. Petersen's Ch Dapsen Nobodys Fool – Exuberant blen with a lovely strong colour. Masculine head with lovely dark eye and nose pigment with excellent earset. Well arched neck and good body, moved OK, just preferred the tailset of the ones before.
5. Murdoch's Brimarvan Forever Young – well coated blen boy who is an ideal size, pleasing head and expression with well cushioned foreface and well set and feathered ears. Presented a pleasing outline standing. Moved OK.

Limit Dog (4,0)



1. Morse & Henderson's Matmor Escape To The Country – Black and Tan boy who is full of enthusiasm and was presented to perfection, raven black coat that was gleaming. Attractive head, well cushioned foreface. He has an excellent neck with good shoulders and level topline, very short coupled with good spring of rib. Moved round the ring freely keeping a nice outline and one that never stopped showing with a constantly wagging tail.
2. Browne's Erieannmada Kings Cross – Lightly marked blen boy who is build on slightly longer lines than the winner. Nice head properties with dark pigment. Well arched neck and

he excels in topline and tailset with ample bone. Moved round the ring with drive keeping a pleasing outline.

3. Kleinitz's Blacktree Double The Luck – well coated and nicely constructed blen built on smaller lines. Pleasing head and expression with darkest of nose and eye pigment. Well bodied and moved. Free and easy movement keeping a level topline and tailset.
4. McLaughlin's Kqrac The Ring of Fire at Caireen – nicely marked and well coated blen boy. Well arched neck, good spring of rib and good front and read angulation, moved steadily round the ring.

Australian Bred Dog (7,0)



1. McInnes' Ch Innesveil Northern Dream (AI) – blen boy who has a pleasing head, well cushioned foreface and a nice flat skull. Well coated of a nice texture with good angulation both front and rear. He stands four square showing off a nice neck and shoulders and excels in his topline and tailset. Moves with drive round the ring keeping an eye catching profile.

2. Caribelle Knls Ch Caribelle Riding Shotgun (AI) – lighter marked blen boy who is built on similar line to the winner. Nice expression with good dark eye and nose pigment, well arched neck and good angulation with ample bone. Well

constructed and coated and moved out well, keeping a balanced outline.

3. Camilleri Ch Kandccamo Ice Cold By Knight – nicely marked blen boy who is an ideal size and shape. Lovely dark eye and nose pigment, flat skull with well placed and feathered ears. Well arched neck and good topline and tailset. Moved with purpose at all times
4. Brooksby's Cavashon Life In The Fast Lane - Well coated and feathered blen boy. A neat package who presented a pleasing outline both standing and on the move. Masculine head and expression framed by well set ears. Moved true both coming and going.
5. Petersen's Ch Cavashon Original Sin – Masculine blen boy, lovely dark eye and nose pigment. Nice neck, level topline and tailset. Moved well keeping a nice outline.

Open Dog (6,1)



1. Morse & Henderson's Supreme Ch, Matmor Pomp And Circumstance - I genuinely don't think I have judge a better ruby, this boy gave me goosebumps when he came in the ring and he didn't disappoint when I went over him on the table. He is presented to absolute perfection with not a hair out of place. His coat is exquisite with a lovely texture and a nice rich colour. He has the most lovely head and expression with a well cushioned foreface and not a hint of harshness and framed by well set and feathered ears. His construction is flawless with lovely front and rear angulation, a well arched neck, level

topline and tailset. When he powers round the ring he has the most stunning outline with his head held high and his constantly wagging tail. Thank you for the opportunity of going over him, a boy that will certainly be hard to beat He never put a paw wrong and I could not deny him Best Dog and Best In Show.

2. Browne's Ch Eireannmada Reuben James – another beautifully presented richly coloured ruby boy. Attractive head and expression that was soft and masculine. Well arched neck and good front. Excels in bone and well sprung ribs. He stood four square and moved with drive at all times keeping an eye catching outline.

3. McLaughlin & Ostmann's Grand Ch Aust Supreme Ch Sheeba Althof Red is Black – 6 ½ year old blen boy who was shown in nice coat and condition with the longest of ear fringes. Well arched neck and good shoulders with excellent topline and tailset. He moved out well keeping a good outline.
4. Wright & Micklem's Ch Kandccamo Chanpagme Supernova – Ruby boy shown in good coat, pleasing head with well cushioned foreface. Nice neck and shoulders with a level topline and tailset. Moved with drive round the ring.
5. Petersen's Ch Dapsen Chip Off the Old Block – 6 ½ year old boy who put his heart and soul into showing today. Profusely coated with the darkest of pigmentation. Moved out well keeping a level topline and tailset.

Veteran Dog (3,0)



1. Caribelle's Sup Ch Caribelle Icy Cold But Cool (AI) – 7 ½ year old blen boy who is so richly coloured, one of the best today. He has the most exquisite expressions that is gentle and most definitely masculine. Excels in neck and shoulders and one of the best topline and tailsets. He has excellent hind angulation that he uses to advantage. I do have a soft spot for the Veterans and this boy was stunning. He comes alive on the move with excellent reach and drive. He was clearly enjoying his time in the ring and I was enjoying watching him present his clear cut outline. He was in my considerations for top honours but with a change of handler in the line up he didn't show as well as he did in the class.
2. Giggins Ch Innesveil Loves Design JC – well broken 7 ½ year old who was shown and presented in excellent coat and condition. He has a lovely clean outline both standing and on the move. Lovely dark eyes and nose pigment with excellent earset. Good neck, level topline and tailset. Moved well both coming and going with a level topline and tailset.
3. Creek's Ch Lakeisha Lord of the Dance – well coated and feathered blen boy who is build on bigger lines to the winner. Good depth of chest, well bodied, good bone for his size. Excellent nose and eye pigment and good earset. Sound on the move both coming and going.

Minor Puppy Bitch (7,2)



1. McInnes' Matmor Dare to Dream – what a lovely little red head this is. Nearly 9 months with the sweetest of heads and expressions with soulful dark eyes that draw you in and have you hooked. She excels in her neck and shoulders and carries herself well on the move keeping a very eye catching outline. Moderate bone and good angulation both front and rear allow her to power round the ring. She really is a smart package and couldn't deny her Best Puppy Bitch and Best Puppy in Show. I will watch her future with interest as I am sure she will make Champion very early.
2. Caribelle Knls' Caribelle Blueberry Bliss – 6 month old blen bitch who I was splitting hairs with the winner of the class and another quality exhibit from this kennel. Attractively marked with a good overall balanced shape and she stands 4 square with a nice outline. She moves round the ring well with an excellent topline and tailset. Prettiest of heads with a well filled muzzle and good earset. Another one from the top drawer who will have a bright future ahead of her.
3. Bryant's Old Rowley Orlaith (Imp NZ) – lightly marked blen who id an ideal size. Moderate bone and good angulation. Pleasing head, excellent nose and eye pigment and well placed ears, nicely arched neck and level topline and tailset. Moved out well.

- Peterson's Dapsen How Fun Is This – sweet tricolour who has nice strong tan in all the right places. Shown in good coat of nice condition, Sweet expression although slightly longer in muzzle than the winners. Moved out well keeping a pleasing outline.
- Kleinits Blacktree Luck Runs My Way – Petite 6 month old blen who has good angulation. Well marked and good topline and tailset. She has the loveliest of natures with a constant wagging tail.

Puppy Bitch (4,0)



- McInnes' Innesveil Northern Treasure – lightly marked blen girl who excels on the move showing off her lovely reach of neck and attractive profile. She is moderate throughout with a good coat and lovely feathering. Pretty head with ample cushioning, lovely flat skull and complete with lozenge. Level topline and tailset completed the picture.
- Kelly & Van Der Wolde's Clarely No Fixed Address – ultra showy blen girl who is another with a lovely reach of neck. Exceptionally well schooled she moves out well and has many similar qualities to the winner just preferring the tailset of number 1.

- Brooksby's Cavashon Lady of The Night – tricolour with lovely strong tan and is smaller in stature than the winners. Feminine expression with lovely dark nose and eye pigment. Moved out confidently with a constantly wagging tail.
- Wright's Belljari Intoxicating Love – Nicely coated ruby with good angulation and tailset. Nice feminine head and expression. Moved out well both coming and going.

Junior Bitch (9,1)



- Wraith & Walsh's Ch Arataci Case In Question – ultra showy and feminine 15 month old ruby. He has a super reach of neck that she uses to advantage both standing and on the move where she presents a clean and attractive outline. Very pretty head with lovely dark nose and eye pigment. Well bodied for her age and presented in good coat and condition. She motored round the ring and most certainly never stopped showing.
- McLaughlin's Kqrac Baltimore Orioles – an attractively marked blen who has good front and rear angulation and depth of chest. She moved well using her good rear angulation, well arched neck and pleasing head and expression.

- Smith's Jessicav Magical World – 12 month old blen who is nice for size and shape. Sweet head and expression with ample cushioning. Good bone for her size and moved well at all times.
- Peachey's Matmor Garden Party – Super sweet ruby girl who is the most glorious colour. Would have liked her a bit more outgoing but boy does she come alive on the move showing off her lovely outline with a level topline and tailset and good angulation.
- Daventri Kennels Ch Daventri Fire Lily – richly coloured blen nice dark nose and eye pigment and a feminine expression. Moved out well keeping a nice outline with a level topline and tailset. Moderate bone and good hind angulation.

Intermediate Bitch (12,5)



- Petersen's Ch Dapsen Do You See What I See – blen girl with striking markings of a nice right colour. She has the darkest of eyes and nose pigment well cushioned foreface and nice flat skull framed by well set and feathered ears. Nice reach of neck and good front and hind angulation. She absolutely scores on movement and drives round the ring keeping a lovely eye catching outline with a level topline and tailset. She was

constantly wagging and pleasing her handler. A really nice bitch that I considered for top honours but just lost out to her kennel mate.

2. Wilshier Ch Cavlamour Pomp And Pizazz - blen girl who scores for overall size and shape. Well proportioned head with a pleasing expression, ample neck and good topline and tailset. She moved well at all times and on the stand presented a clean outline with good hind angulation.
3. Morse & Henderson's Matmor It Girl (AI) – Ruby girl who is slightly larger in frame than the winners. She has a very pretty and feminine expression with nicely set ears and excellent dark nose and eye pigment. Ample bone and moved well both coming and going.
4. Underhill's Jezzamont Lollobrigida – richly marked blen girl with the sweetest of heads framed by well set ears and nice flat skull. She is good for size and has good hind angulation Moved well keeping a level topline and tailset.
5. Caribelle Knls Ch Caribelle Kahlua On Ice – Another richly marked blen with a pretty head and well filled muzzle good front and rear angulation. Ample bone for size and moved well both coming and going.

Limit Bitch (10,0)



1. Taylor's Dapsen Whatever It Takes – shapely tri colour bitch who is half sister of the previous class winner. Shown in nice coat and condition with gleaming tan in the correct places. Pleasing head with well set and feathered ears, nice dark nose and eye pigment and good earset. She presents a nice clean outline both standing and on the move. She drives round the ring using her well muscled hind quarters and keeping a level topline and tailset

2. McInnes' Innesveil Riverboat Princess (AI) – another quality bitch from this kennel. Ultra feminine head and expression with nice dark eyes and well filled muzzle. She is

well bodied with a good rib cage and nice front and rear angulation. She moved round the ring OK but she was very distracted and really wasn't playing ball for her handler.

3. Rosales' Eirenmada My My Delilah – Black and Tan who was heavier made than my winners. Nice head good front and rear angulation and moved well keeping a nice outline with a level topline and tailset.
4. Kleinitz's Blacktree Queen of Mystery – Feminine blen who had the deepest of nose and eye pigment, well cushioned foreface. Ample bone for her size. Moved well both coming and going.
5. Irvine's Torquella Its About Time – Blen with good dark pigment. Well set ears and nice flat skull, good reach of neck and good front and rear angulation. Nice positive movement keeping a pleasing outline.

Australian Bred Bitch (10,0)



1. Morse & Henderson's Ch Matmor Thrilled To Bits - another exquisite Ruby from these exceptionally clever breeders. She has the prettiest of heads with that ultra feminine look, darkest of eyes and a well cushioned foreface. She excels in her well arched neck and I would say has the best of 'deportment' as she strides out round the ring with her head naturally held high. She is very well coated and it is of a lovely soft texture. Both standing and on the move she has a lovely outline with a level topline and fantastic tailset. She motors round the ring using her well muscled hind quarters to power herself round. She is another that

was so eager to please her handler and my notes say 'I wish she were mine' and I really do! Couldn't deny her Best Bitch and Best Opposite Sex.

2. Schmidt Brades Jamaya – blen shown in fabulous coat and condition. Nice feminine expression, lovely limpid dark eyes and nose pigment, nice flat skull and good earset. She has a graceful gently arched neck set on a level topline and good tailset. Nice spring of rib and carrying the right amount of weight. She drives round the ring keeping a nice outline. She was so well schooled and shown to great advantage to beat some lovely champions in this class. A quality bitch.
3. Wraith’s Ch Matmor Set The Stage – well coated black and tan who is another that is so well schooled. Feminine head and expression with a well filled muzzle. Good front and rear angulation and ample bone for her size. Moved well both coming and going.
4. Wynn’s Ch Jenawyn Fireworks (AI) – blen with a nice coat of good condition. Feminine head and expression with dark nose pigment. Good bone, well sprung ribs and well let down hocks. Moved steadily at all times.
5. Peachey’s Ch Matmor Thrill Of The Chase – neatly made black and tan with good angulation front and rear. Moved steadily round the ring and presents a neat outline while standing.

Open Bitch (8,2)



1. Petersen’s Sup Ch Dapsen Mirror Mirror – what a classy blen girl this is and at 6 ½ she is certainly not lost her verve for showing as she was constantly on her toes with her tail constantly wagging. She has a very feminine head and expression with lovely clear cut and attractive face markings showing off her well filled muzzle and the darkest of nose and eye pigment. A gently arching neck with good shoulder placement and correct front and rear movement. On the stack she has a lovely clear cut outline standing four square and you certainly can’t ignore this quality girl. I was splitting hairs between her and the glamorous ruby

girl and also pushed hard by her younger kennel mate, but she pulled out all the stops to gain Reserve Best Bitch.

2. Wraith’s Sup Ch Matmor In The Society Pages – another pretty ruby from this consistent kennel. Shown in lovely coat and condition with ample feathering. Lovely large dark eyes and nose pigment. Good reach of neck and well placed shoulders. She moved round the ring with grace and ease keeping a lovely profile and a correct topline and tailset. She is another one who gave her all for her handler, its great to see a Cavalier enjoying being ring, a pleasure to go over this lovely exhibit.
3. Morse & Henderson’s Ch Matmor La Stupenda (AI) – another pretty red head who powered round the ring with her tail constantly thrashing away. Well cushioned foreface and lovely earset. Well arched neck and good front and rear angulation. For me she was carrying a little too much weight which detracted from her overall outline standing and on the move. However a quality exhibit who’s place couldn’t be denied.
4. Nichol’s Blacktree Come From Away – Ultra feminine blen girl who is attractively marked and an ideal size and shape. Very pretty head and expression with a lovely earset and flat skull. She isn’t overdone in any way and moved round the ring with grace and ease. Just coming back from a litter and with more coat will trouble the best.
5. Wright’s Ch Belljari Age of Adeline – another ruby girl of ideal size and shape, excels in neck and shoulders, ample bone for her size and a well sprung ribs, Moves with drive round the ring keeping a nice overall shape.

Veteran Bitch (1,0)



1. McInnes Ch Innesveil Love Spell – 9 year old blen with the sweetest of heads. Lovely dark eye and nose pigment for her age and good earset. Lovely bone for her size and well sprung ribs. Moved out well both coming and going, clearly enjoying her day in the ring as her tail never stopped wagging.

Neuter Dog (4,0)



1. Giggins' Neut. Gr Ch Cavalrite Sir Lancelot – 7 year old black and tan boy shown in profuse coat of lovely condition. Masculine head with good earset. Nicely arched neck and good front and rear angulation that were used to advantage to drive round the ring. Presented a lovely outline both standing and on the move with a lovely topline and tailset.
2. Newland's Biddyk Prim N Proper – 2 yr old blen boy who has a lovely coat of excellent condition and presented to perfection. Attractive head and well filled muzzle. Nicely arched neck and level topline. Good front and rear angulation and moved well round the ring.
3. Irvine's Australian Ice Cool Bombadier – lighter marked 8 year old blen boy who has a pleasing head and expression. Nice dark eye and nose pigment and good earset. Has a level topline and tailset and moved well at all angles.
4. Newland's Bindyk Archer on Landale TK.S Lighter marked blen boy who was shown in good coat. Well arched neck and good angulation. Well bodies and moved steadily round the ring.

Neuter Bitch (3,0)



1. Smith's Ch Neuter Ch Jessicav Kiss Me I'm Hot Swn – 6 year old tri girl who has a pretty head, moderate and typical in every way, super soft expression, good dark eyes and good pigment. Lovely body and good conformation. She moves out with style and elegance, with lovely head carriage and keeping a nice topline and tailset. Best Neuter In Show.
2. Retrac Kennels Retrac In The Line Of Fire – 6 year old blen who moves round the ring with verve and enthusiasm for the job in hand. Pretty head and expression with well cushioned foreface and limpid dark eyes. Good angulation and well sprung ribs and ample bone. Moved round the ring with drive.
3. Milne's Neut Ch Elreav Caramel Fudge CD RA TD – lightly marked 8 year old blen feminine and gentle expression, nicely arched neck and good angulation. Moved round the ring well keeping a nice outline with a level topline and tailset.
