Secretary's Report

Our last event for 2014 was our Member's competition held in conjunction with Dog's Big Day Out in December. Our judge, Lesley Fairhall enjoyed judging our dogs. We were pleased with the attendance. The annual handler's competitions were held and it was lovely to see youngsters with other breeds joining in our competition. We thank those members who attended and contributed to a great day. Results can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.

As we launch into a new cavalier year, we have made some changes to the calendar. Due to the high chance of extreme weather at the end of February and the clash between our Open Show and the Canberra Royal, we have requested, and have been granted, permission to move this fixture to be held in conjunction with Dog's Big Day Out in December. This will commence on 13th December, 2015 meaning that for this year only, we will be holding two Open Shows. A Pet's Parade and the annual handler's competition will be held in conjunction with the Open Show which we hope will attract lots of support from our pet members. This means that this year we will be holding two Championship Shows and two Open Shows. At this stage there are no plans to hold a Member's Competition.

As many will have seen in the media, there have been a number of dogs seized by the RSPCA from a puppy farm. Among these dogs there was at least one Cavalier. I was in phone contact with the RSPCA the very next day. At the moment these dogs are NOT legally the property of the RSPCA and as such can't be put into foster homes or rehomed. They have been seized, not surrendered. The process could take up to two months. Meanwhile the dogs are being housed at the Burwood Facility and are being re-educated by their behavioural specialists.

I have offered the club's assistance in rehoming any cavaliers and pointed out that we have a long list of people looking for older cavaliers. I have left my contact details if they need our help in any way. I confirmed our interest in helping with these dogs in writing. The letter can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.

We have planned a Special General Meeting for Wednesday 11th March at Bulla and have included the Agenda in the newsletter. Please notify me of your intention to attend this meeting. If there is not enough interest, we will cancel and move all business to the August meeting.

Our next two events are not far away with the Open Show on 1st March with club member and breed specialist Will Henderson (Matmor) officiating. As you can see, we have left entries open much later than usual, so there will be very little room for late entries, so you will need to have your entries with Showmanager no later than the closing date. Our second Agility Trial on 21st March is highly anticipated. We thank Sue Smith and Roxanne Eddy for their efforts to ensure that this event goes ahead. Schedules for both are in this newsletter.

As we head into the hottest part of the year, please ensure that your dogs have plenty of shade, water and whatever you do don't leave them in cars.

Text of letter sent to RSPCA

I refer to my telephone conversation with Andrea this afternoon regarding the above rescue situation. I note that there is at least one Cavalier King Charles Spaniel amongst the dogs seized yesterday.

I would like to confirm my offer on behalf of the club to assist with the socializing and rehoming of this dog and any other cavaliers you might have in your care. I do understand that these dogs have not yet been surrendered to your organization at this time and that this process could take some time. However, when the time is right, we have members who are willing to act as foster carers and to assist in the socialization of these dogs. We also have a long list of people looking for an older cavalier to adopt.

Golden Oldies

While there is absolutely no question that all of our Cavaliers are special, it has to be said that there is something *extra* special about our gorgeous Golden Oldies. And in this article, I'd like to share my own Golden Oldie's story.

When I first encountered Baxter, our family already had one Cavalier – our darling Chandler (who incidentally also went on to become a Golden Oldie – he departed for Rainbow Bridge in December 2011 at the ripe old age of 15). I was wandering around the local shopping centre one afternoon, and *of course* that meant I had to pop into the pet shop "just to have a look". And there, quietly chewing on a fluffy toy crocodile, was a tiny Blenheim Cavalier puppy. I rang my Mum: "there's a Blenheim Cavalier puppy at the pet store!" And that was all it took – my mother had long harboured a soft spot for Blenheims!

Baxter came home with me, and quickly settled into our household, devotedly following Chandler around everywhere. He passed through the puppy destructive phase (his most impressive effort was destroying a beanbag and turning our playroom into a veritable winter wonderland), and amused us when we took him out for walks, only to have him inexplicably flatten himself onto the footpath at random intervals; once he was picked up and set on his feet again, he'd trot along beside us quite happily! Baxter also had his fair share of goofy moments – I vividly remember the day he managed to walk smack bang into a wall after turning his head to look back at me with the eyes of love!

That little Blenheim Cavalier puppy grew into a gangly adolescent, and then, finally, into a solid adult. When the dogs and I moved out of home, Baxter quickly became the favourite with my housemates – they loved how he would always patiently wait for his turn for a pat, his waggy tail, and how his whole face lights up when he smiles. When Fletcher joined the household, Baxter became the patient grandfather figure, allowing his ears to be pulled and letting himself be wrestled to the ground. He has also taken on this same role with Soldier, who vastly prefers playing with Baxter to playing with Fletcher!

When I moved to the northern suburbs of Victoria, I also started attending the local dog obedience club. Last year, I started taking Baxter along, just for a bit of fun, but he showed that in spite of his age, he was more than capable of doing what was asked of him. Baxter has participated in three dog club "fun days", and has won his class each time. He also netted us the "Highest Scoring Dog/Trainer of the Year" award at the first of the fun days he participated in; it means a lot to know that his name is engraved on one of the club's perpetual trophies.

I never ask more of Baxter than he can give, and have absolutely no expectations of him; as long as he has fun, that's all I care about. With that in mind, I decided to take a punt and enter him in a Rally Obedience trial, just to see what he would do. And he showed me up massively! The old fella earned his Rally Novice title in early 2014 in a clean sweep (three trials, three passes), and at the tail end of the 2014 trialling season, he also attained his Rally Advanced title, which included a pass earned in gale force winds that were strong enough to almost impede his ability to walk forwards; as it was, the judge had to follow us around the Rally course and reattach signs that were in serious danger of blowing away! Completing Rally Advanced was a bit more challenging for Baxter, as the additional exercises were a bit more taxing on his old bones, but he managed it in typical Baxter fashion with a smile on his face and a wag in his tail. My special thanks to judges Y. Ross, F. Brueckner, and L. Klecka, who deemed the old fella worthy of a pass in the Advanced ring; he has retired from the performance ring on a high note.

Baxter will be 14 in February next year. While he might be a bit slower than he used to be, he still has perfectly adequate sight and hearing, and a fantastic range of movement – he can

navigate the stairs of our two storey townhouse easily, jump up on the couch when he has a mind to, make the occasional lightning fast dash towards something that interests him, and dance the dance of the happy Cavalier at dinnertime. He is in good health (aside from an asymptomatic Grade 3 heart murmur), thoroughly enjoys his walks and training sessions at dog club, and has an incredibly luscious coat that fluffs up brilliantly after a bath! He is happy, patient, and full of love for his family.

So here's cheers to our wonderful Golden Oldies – may they continue to give us as much love as they always have!
